Executive Director - Craig King



Day Program Services.


Building renovations will soon be under way at GO's Day Services Program at 2842 Story Road, San Jose. Building improvements will meet new code requirements and cosmetic changes will provide a colorful, bright face to the program.

Supported Living Services

Go Consumers with the greatest needs receive ongoing, in-home support from GO SLS staff to maintain their independence in the community. Services are tailored to the need of the individual and may range from a few hours to a week 24/7 for persons with multiple impairments.

Independent Living Services

160 GO consumers live independently in apartments throughout Santa Clara County. The six-unit Cortez Street building in Sunnyvale owned and operated by GO provides transitional housing and hosts ILS classes taught three hours per day, four days per week. Topics include cooking, nutrition, anger management, money management, bargain shopping, laundry and housekeeping and much more.




Holiday Party!
